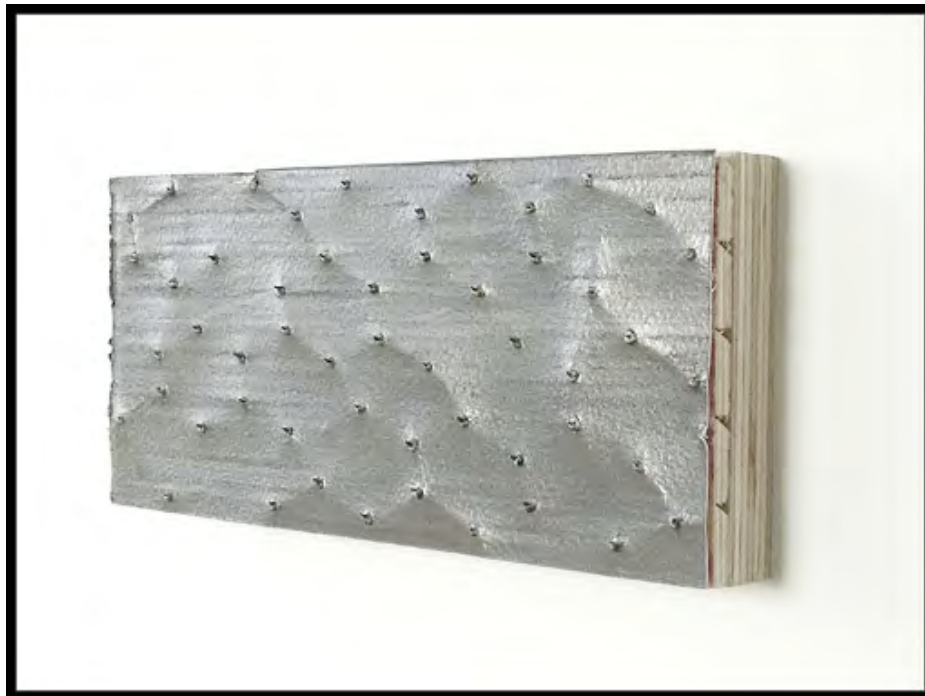
Northern Exposure
